Introduction

The Centre for Teaching, Learning and Programme Development is excited to announce the Call for Papers for the upcoming conference on the scholarship of teaching and learning. We invite scholars, educators, researchers, and practitioners to submit papers and join us in re-envisioning the future of teaching and learning through the lens of data analytics and a evidence-based curriculum implementation. Selected papers presented at the conference may be considered for inclusion in a special issue in a DHET accredited journal.

For this conference and the special issue, we invite both theoretical and empirical papers that critically engage with questions such as:

- 1. What are the best practices for leveraging technology and digital platforms to facilitate data-driven teaching and learning?
- 2. How can institutions support academic staff in developing the necessary skills and competencies for effectively using data analytics in their teaching practices?
- 3. How can data analytics contribute to addressing complex global challenges, such as climate change, social inequality, and political conflict, through teaching and learning?
- 4. What are the challenges associated with assessing and evaluating the effectiveness of data-driven teaching practices, and how can these challenges be addressed?
- 5. What curriculum practices and innovations can make the world a better place for all?
- 6. How can hate and prejudice be reduced among people through the scholarship of teaching and learning?
- 7. How can scholarship of teaching and learning mitigate gender-based violence, xenophobia, and structural exclusion?
- 8. What is the contribution of scholarship of teaching and learning to peace dialogues in the 21st century?
- 9. How can a borderless curriculum foster acceptance of minority groups, the excluded, and those facing epistemic injustice?
- 10. What would a relevant scholarship of teaching and learning look like in an attempt to contribute positively to humanity
