Vice-Chancellor and Principal

PROFESSOR ANDREW CROUCH JOINED SOL PLAATJE UNIVERSITY, IN APRIL 2020, AS ITS SECOND VICE-CHANCELLOR AND PRINCIPAL, AND HAS LAUNCHED SEVERAL INAUGURAL INITIATIVES RELATED TO HIS FIVE-POINT FOCUS PLAN ON TAKING SOL PLAATJE UNIVERSITY FORWARD INTO THE NEXT PHASE OF ITS DEVELOPMENT.



His first days as Vice-Chancellor and Principal were dominated by forging a successful response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the effect of the national lockdown on the academic project. He drew on his extensive experience in introducing applications of new pedagogies in the digital sphere, championing the use of innovative educational technologies and integrating technology into existing teaching and learning programmes across multiple platforms; to steer Sol Plaatje University as it successfully moved to online learning.

His vast administrative leadership expertise meant that he could ensure that Sol Plaatje University was one of a handful of universities in South Africa that completed the 2020 academic year on time, while keeping the University fully operational.

AND SURROUNDING COMMUNITIES.

To this end he spearheaded the signing of a Town and Gown Agreement between the University and the Sol Plaatje Local Municipality for the future collaboration and engagement between the city and the University.

Since April 2020, the University has also increased its landholding through the purchase of the Tafel Lager Stadium in Kimberley.

Under the management of Professor Crouch the University launched its first research entity, the DSI and NRF funded Risk and Vulnerability Science Centre. This will set Sol Plaatje University on a path to becoming a research leader in the study of arid environments and Desert Studies.

In October 2021, the University also launched the Talent Pipeline Programme, funded by the Anglo-American Foundation, which is an initiative aimed at producing more university ready learners from rural and peri-urban schools in the Northern Cape Province. This is the flagship programme of Professor's Crouch's tenure as Vice-Chancellor and Principal since it talks directly to his quest to make the dreams of young people become a reality.

Born in Kimberley to Jacob and Louisa Crouch and an alumnus of William Pescod High School, this son of the Northern Cape returned to his roots to take the helm at Sol Plaatje University.

Prior to joining Sol Plaatje University Professor Crouch served as the Vice-Principal and Deputy Vice-Chancellor: Academic at Wits University for eight years. He also served as Executive Dean of the Faculty of Science at Wits for four years before his promotion to Deputy Vice Chancellor Academic.

During his eleven years at Wits he spearheaded the digital and online initiatives at the University, including the establishment of innovative teaching and learning spaces, smart classrooms, virtual learning spaces, as well as a proposed novel centre for educational technologies.

Before his tenure at Wits University, he was at Stellenbosch University, where he had served

as a Professor of Chemistry and the Associate Dean of Natural Sciences.

A full Professor of chemistry for the past 29 years, Professor Crouch worked at the University of the Western Cape for seven years, three of which was as the Head of Department of Chemistry.

He holds a BSc (Chemistry and Biochemistry) and a BSc Honours in Chemistry from the University of the Western Cape and a PhD in Chemistry from Concordia University, Montreal, Canada.

An active member in the African higher education sector, Professor Crouch has wideranging experience in teaching, research and postgraduate training, having developed courses and taught at all tertiary levels. He is the recipient of numerous awards for teaching, research and administration. The most notable of these are the prestigious Ernest Oppenheimer Memorial Trust Fellowship and Gold Medal from the Anglo-American Chairman's Fund as well as the Excellence in Teaching and Research Award from the International Society of Electrochemistry for his contribution to the field of Electrochemistry in South Africa.

PROFESSOR PRISCILLA BAKER

PROFESSOR PRISCILLA BAKER IS A PROFESSOR OF CHEMISTRY AT THE UNIVERSITY OF THE WESTERN CAPE (UWC) AND HOLDS AN NRF C2-RATING AS A SCIENTIST.

She is the SARChI chair in Analytical Systems and Processes for Priority and Emerging Contaminants. Her research into the use of electrochemical sensors as sensitive and selective analytical tools has a direct bearing on the monitoring and re-assessment of guidelines for safe water use.

Professor Baker obtained her BSc at the University of Cape Town and then completed her National Diploma in Analytical Chemistry, first class, at the Cape Peninsula University of Technology. She was drawn into the domain of electrochemistry research during her National Diploma internship. She studied under the mentorship of Professor Andrew Crouch and graduated with a BSc Honours (Chemistry) and successfully completed her MSc dissertation (Chemistry) whilst registered at UWC. In 2004 she received her PhD (Chemistry) at the University of Stellenbosch.

Her very successful academic career was recognised when she received the Distinguished Woman Scientist (Natural Sciences and Engineering) Award from the Department of Science and Technology in August 2014.

In 2016 Professor Baker took over as Director of the Southern African Systems Analysis Centre where she managed the programme's first three-year cycle from 2016 to 2018.

She was the Co-Director of the first International Associated Laboratory established between the UWC SensorLab and University Cergy-Pontoise (Paris, France), an esteemed external research, teaching and training laboratory. She was appointed as Fellow in Residence on the Paris-Seine Initiative for Excellence for the period March-June 2020 to cement this partnership.
